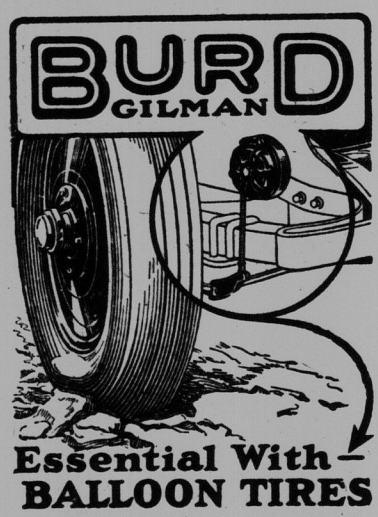

HALIFAX AND EASTPORT TIE FOR FIRST PLACE

Leaders in Bowling Tourney Each Score Victory Today

EACH HAS LOST ONE AND WON SIX GAMES

More Good Scores As Last Day of Tournament Begins

At the conclusion of morning play at the bowling tournament here this morning on the Y. M. C. I. alleys the Halifax and Eastport teams were still tied for the championship of the Maritime Provinces and Eastern Maine. The Halifaxians won against St. Stephen, 1475 to 1387, while Eastport took Truro into camp by more than 200 pins, the totals being 1354 to 1158. In the other games this morning Moncton defeated St. Stephen but was set back in the race when it dropped its game to the Y. M. C. I. aggregation.
