BOMB BLAST SETS JAIL IN BIG PANIC

Three Prisoners Injured in Attempted Jail Delivery in Ohio.

Warren, Ohio, April 9.—Three prisoners were injured and thirty others were panic when a dynamite bomb was exploded under a window in the west corridor of the Trumbull county jail here.

The blast tore a hole through the four-foot stone wall on the west side of the building, too small, however, to permit the wholesale jail delivery, which it is thought, was the aim of the perpetrators of the bombing. Windows throughout the jail were shattered by the explosion, and glass showered upon prisoners, some of whom cowered in their cells while others, with the freedom of the corridors, ran shouting and screaming in terror.

Overcrowded with prisoners, including bootleggers, thieves, murder suspects and others, some of whom are under sentence to the penitentiary and scheduled to leave for Columbus to start their terms soon the jail was in panic for several minutes after the blast.

Sheriff John E. Thomas, whose residence adjoins the jail in the rear, together with his family, was awakened by the blast and pushed into the jail proper, where the wildest scenes of disorder were being enacted as some of the prisoners sought means of escaping, and others in the cells beat their fists against the bars and shouted to be turned loose.

John Chaffee, turnkey, who sleeps in a small office just outside the cell department, also was awakened by the explosion and rushed into the jail proper to assist Sheriff Thomas in restoring order.

Sheriff Thomas started a round-up immediately after the explosion, and three or four prisoners suspected of probable complicity in the dynamiting were placed in solitary confinement.

BOSTON HAS FIRST THUNDER STORM
Heavy Fall of Rain, but Little Damage Done.

The first electrical storm of the year visited Boston on last Thursday evening, with heavy rainfall but no damage. Telephone lines were affected in some localities, especially in Middlesex county, and electric lights in Wakefield were out of commission for an hour.

In Quincy lightning struck and shattered the flag pole on the postoffice building on Washington street, fragments being hurled across the street to the lawn of the Thomas Crane library. Bolts also hit the electric light wires leading to the Quincy Theatre and the Alhambra Theatre. The heavy crash of the bolts threw several women in both theatres into hysterics, but they were soon quieted.

Lightning also burned out a transformer in the N. Y., N. H. and H. yard and a fuse-box at Whitney road and Hancock street. Lights in Masonic hall, City square, and in many private houses were affected.

The storm started shortly after 8 o'clock and nearly half an inch of rain fell in the following two hours. The lightning was brilliant. The temperature was 37 degrees, only five from the freezing point.
