IMPROVEMENT OF HOSPITAL WILL COST HALF MILLION

Scheme Submitted to Commis- sioners by Members of Staff—Separate Building for Private and Maternity Cases.

On behalf of the staff of the General Hospital, Dr. W. W. White and Dr. L. M. Curran submitted to the board of hospital commissioners a scheme for the improvement of the hospital, at a cost of \$500,000. The scheme provided for the alteration of the main building so that it should give accommodation to ward patients and maternity cases. After the report of the staff containing the recommendation was read, while spokes of the needle of the committee members and Dr. Curran of an enlarged out-patient department. J. King Kelly said that a set of plans calling for an improvement of the hospital accommodation had been submitted to the municipal council five years ago. The report of the finance committee recommended a plan for raising money for the hospital extension by means of a campaign.

The superintendent, Dr. H. Heiden, submitted a report in which was announced that Miss Mary Chiles Scott of Lexington, Ky., had been appointed superintendent of nurses and took up her duties on January 1. Miss Dorothy Huntin has been appointed director and will enter upon her duties on January 8. On motion it was agreed that \$2,500 should be added to estimates for an emergency lighting system.

The meeting was presided over by M. E. Agar and the other commissioners present were J. King Kelly, William Emerson, Frank Flewelling, J. L. O'Brien, Dr. G. R. J. Crawford and Alexander McMillan.

CHARGED WITH DYNAMITING A VIRGINIA MINE

Fayetteville, W. Va., Jan. 6.—Four men have been run down by bloodhounds and arrested by the state police for complicity in the dynamiting on Tuesday night of a mine incline railway of the Willard Branch Coal Co. at Willard. Branch, according to information received here last night.

The Willard's Branch Coal Co., in September, 1919, decided to operate its mines under an open shop policy. Since that time its power houses have been fired upon and a quantity of dynamite was exploded near the mouth of a mine. The explosion Tuesday night was the third attack on the company's property since September, 1919.

It is expected that a section of the concrete main between Latimer Lake and Phinney's Hill will have to be re- newed as several holes are said to exist in the pipe.
