RABAT, French Morocco, June 11—Paul Painleve, Premier of France, arrived here by airplane at 6 o'clock Wednesday night on his flying tour of inspection to the Riffian war zone.

Painleve and his party were tired out, but immediately began conferences with French military chiefs. Friday, the Premier will make an inspection of the battle front.

Painleve is anxious to dispel any anxiety existing in America regarding the intentions of France in the present campaign.
