\$100,000 A YEAR LAWYERS. LONDON, Jan. 12—Earnings of the law officers of the Crown are set out by the Financial Secretary to the Treasury as follows: In 1924-25 the Attorney-General, Sir P. Hastings, received a total amount of \$950,000, and Sir D. Hogg \$60,000. The Solicitor-General, Sir H. H. Slesser, received \$350,000, and Sir T. Inskip a similar amount.
