BROUGHT DOWN 50 GERMAN PLANES IN LESS THAN A YEAR

Rene Fenck Now Star Air Fighter of France

441/8 Has Fourteen Palms - Says the Chief Thing is Manoeuvring Opponent-Easy to Fight Seven at Same Time

(By Walter Duranty, special cable to the New York Times and Montreal Gazette.)

But his round face, with its fair complexion, budding moustache and long hair, brushed back from the forehead, has exactly the same expression of boyish confidence in proved ability as that of a hero of the track, diamond or griding.
