what we have done, we are the richer, not the poorer. "There is that scattereth, and yet increaseth, and withholdeth more than is meet, and it tendeth to poverty."

Let us not relax our efforts then, or think of doing any less. Rather let us each ask with more passionate earnestness than ever—"Lord, what wilt Thou have me to do?"

"Brethren, the time is short," "and the fashion of this world is passing away."
