the life saving station now is.

Capt. Myers was born June 16, 1840 at sea while coming from the West Indies. His father's name was Jam 3 Myers. Capt. Myers has lived in South Lubec all his life. He was in the service only four days wh.n a sen was born who is now stationed at Cross Island life saving station, and he has an older boy at Islesford station. Capt. Myers is now in the service 23 years and has handled 185 wrecks, and lost only one man from the wrecks, and had one of his crew die of exposure. He has had 68 men in his employ and has recommended 77 men for the services. He was the first one this side of Cape Cod to use the breeches buoy. In 1877 while aiding the ship Henry of London with a crew of 22, he lost only one man and came near losing his own life. The man lived only seven minutes after they brought him ashore. The captain was taken to his life saving station, and with two weeks of good nursing, came out all right. It took four hours to aid this ship. Jan. 9, 1836, while helping schooner Murther Proudy of St. John, N. B., he saved all on board except a valuable dog. Not long ago the yacht Ideal of Boston was a total loss, and had a narrow escape from losing the crew as well.
