GRAHAME-WHITE TO WED PAULINE CHASE FRUIT CAN BE MANUFACTURED

English Aviator Admits He Will Marry Actress--Wedding Will Take Place in the Early Spring. New York, Oct. 20.—Miss Pauline Chase—more familiar to New Yorkers as "Pretty Polly of the pink pajamas"—is really and truly going to be married at last, but not to James M. Barrie, the famous author, who is her godfather and who recently was said to be her admirer; not to any of the young princelings and millionaires who have paid tribute to her wonderful eyes and wonderful golden hair.

But to whom, do you suppose? To no less a personage than Claude Grahame-White, the English aviator, who recently dropped in upon Washington's official center from the sky, via bi-plane; who captured all the big prizes at the Boston aviation meet and occasionally picks up \$5,000 or \$6,000 a day in "fares" from venture-some souls who he takes aloft for 10 minutes apiece—at \$500 per soul.

None of Miss Chase's immediate relatives being here at present, her manager, Charles Frohman, announced the engagement. He made the news public at the Knickerbocker theatre after the performance of "Our Miss Gibbs," in which the dainty little comedienne is playing the main role. Mr. Frohman said that the marriage would be celebrated in the spring on the other side of the water. She and Mr. Grahame-White have been friends for nine years, having met in London when Miss Chase first went there as a member of one of the Edna May companies. Mr. Grahame-White does not intend to allow his engagement to interfere with his air work, and it is all the more determined to capture some of the great prizes offered for the coming meet at Belmont Park. Miss Chase declares that she will be present to wish him success every time he goes up.

"Polly's" original fame came when she was in the Liberty Bells company in this city and rolled out of bed in pink pajamas. She really did do good dramatic work later, however, when Mr. Barrie adopted her as his daughter and made her the star of his English Peter Pan company. The members of the company were the first to hear of the engagement, and they crowded about the actress with congratulations. Miss Chase and Mr. Grahame-White hurried away in a motor as soon as possible. When hailed at the door of the machine the flyer laughed, came as near to blushing as it was possible for him to come, and begged: "O, say, old chap; give a fellow a chance; ye know. O, yes, it's true, and I'm jolly glad, too!" "And say that for me also!" chimed in Miss Chase. Miss Chase recently made a flight with Grahame-White, but no sentimental significance was attached to it at the time.

SHE HAS FOUND HER SOUL MATE Miss Antoinette Gazzam Weds Chas. B. Galvin, a New York Engineer--Sequel to Romantic Courtship.

Corwall, N. Y., Oct. 20.—The marriage of Miss Antoinette Gazzam, whose fortune is more than \$3,000,000, to Charles B. Galvin, who was employed as an assistant civil engineer on the Aqueduct, in the little chapel of the Church of St. Thomas of Canterbury here, was the culmination of the bride's search for an ideal companion. None but immediate relatives, several friends of Mrs. Galvin and Mr. Galvin's parents and sister were at the simple wedding.

Like Drifting into Heaven. Mrs. Galvin said:—"One usually imagines that a bride is in a state of fear and trepidation at the altar, but I felt no fear. It was just like floating into Heaven and my husband is an angel." Mrs. Galvin did not tell how she discovered her ideal companion, for whom she has had a vast amount of territory searched by Pinkerton detectives. She found Mr. Galvin at her very door. She first saw her husband at the Cornwall station. Instantly she recognized him as corresponding to the specifications of her ideal. He received three letters. Now they are married.

Very Romantic, She Says. A Dainty Pin Cushion. A new pin cushion is a revival of an old-fashioned one. It is made with sides of heavy meshed wide canvas cut to form a basket and filled with a well stuffed cushion. It can be of any desired size, but one of good proportions has the top five and a half inches long, the top five and a half inches deep and the sides two and a half inches deep. Wedge shaped pieces are fitted in each end and the entire case is bound with colored satin ribbon an inch wide. The extended top is filled in with a pin cushion made of bran or wool and covered with velvet to match the binding. Rosettes of the ribbon are put at each corner and a hanger is added from one rosette to the other. Sometimes, instead of the wedged ends, the canvas is bound in a seam and the tops bulged to admit the cushion.
