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## TWO OTHER NORTH SHORE BOYS DEAD

Donald McCullum of Tabusnitac and Thomas S. Wiseman Have Made the Sacrifice.

## Tabusnitac, Nov. 18.—Mrs. Thomas

McCullum has received official notice that her eldest son, Donald, has made the supreme sacrifice. A letter received from an officer who has had further particulars concerning his death. Slightly wounded in the knee, about to proceed to the dressing station when a bursting shell caused his instant death. The news coming just at this time when the joy bells are ringing in our town a new era of peace on earth, is especially sad. Private McCullum enlisted in the 55th Battalion and had been in good health during the years spent overseas with the exception of a short time spent in hospital from an injury due to a kick from a horse.

Their friends deeply sympathize with his parents and brothers and sisters who survive.

Mrs. Joseph Wiseman of New Bandon, who formerly belonged here, received recently a letter from the chaplain of the 8th Can. Inf. Batt. to which her late son, Thomas S. Wiseman, belonged. The letter follows:

Dear Mrs. Wiseman—I am the chaplain of the 8th Can. Inf. Batt. to which your son, Lance-Sergeant T. S. Wiseman, No. 73494, belonged. You will have been officially notified of his death on Sept. 30th. I am writing to confirm the sad news and to assure you of our sympathy in your sorrow.

Your son was killed during the recent operation near Cambrai where some of the hardest fighting of the war has taken place. In your sorrow it will be a source of consolation to you to keep in mind that when your loved one made the supreme sacrifice he was aiding in a great and righteous cause to drive the cruel invaders from the land they have so heartlessly laid waste, and to make freedom secure for all mankind.

Honored indeed is he who suffers in such a glorious cause. The good Master will give him his due reward for work well done.

## REXTON

REXTON, N. B., Nov. 17.—When the announcement of peace was confirmed Monday, the citizens of Rexton, Richibucto and surrounding country ceased their labors and assembled for a thanksgiving celebration. The first meeting was held in front of the court house at Richibucto, at which all the clergymen of the two towns were present and delivered addresses.

The Lord's Prayer was said by the multitude and hymns of thanksgiving sung. After this a procession of autos was formed and proceeded to Rexton. These were all prettily decorated and contained bells, guns, drums, etc., which aided by the church bells and whistles, continued to spread the glad tidings. After parading through Rexton, all lined up at the square and hymns, prayers and addresses of thanksgiving were delivered, terminating with God Save the King.

In the evening there were bonfires. Thursday's storm brought sufficient snow for sleighing, but when wheels got running again the roads were spoiled. Both are being used today.

The schooner Maude Weston, Capt. Weston, has gone into winter quarters, and the Divina, Capt. Fraser, is discharging her last cargo for the season and will lay up.

R. O'Leary's mill has begun the season's operations. The shipbuilders have received several cartloads of lumber from British Columbia this week and expect shortly to have sufficient lumber to resume operations.

Antoine Robichaud of this town, has received word of the death of his youngest brother, Jaddus, who passed away at a hospital in St. John, Nov. 12, at the age of 27 years.

The death occurred at East Galloway a few days ago of Mary Irene, one of the two daughters of Mr. and Mrs. Robert Boucher. The little one had influenza. Interment was made at St. Anne. Other members of the family are recovering.

The epidemic has made great havoc among the Indian people at the Big Cove Reserve, fourteen of their number passed away within a few days. They were mostly children.

Thomas Peters of Peter's Mills, is seriously ill with paralysis.

Mrs. Annie Smith suffered a stroke of paralysis a few days ago, and lies dangerously ill at the home of her brother, Thomas O'Connor.

Miss Lucie Mallett is fully recovered from her attack of influenza.

Mrs. W. J. Fraser, her sons Leo and Charlie and little daughter Kathleen are able to be about again after a severe attack of influenza.

There are no new cases of the disease here.

Mr. and Mrs. Donald Glenross of Upper Rexton, have been informed that their eldest son, James, has been killed in action, and also that another son, Gordon, has been wounded. James was with the United States Army. Mr. and Mrs. Glenross had five sons in the State a few months ago.
