



Someone has just published a book about Canada. It is only a little book—about eighty pages—but it contains an astonishing amount of information. It will tell you how many cities there are in Canada; how many people there are in those cities; how many bushels of wheat were grown in 1924 and how much money the government makes out of the business of governing. It will also tell you, incidentally, that Victoria, B. C. is one of the most beautiful cities of the world and that Vancouver has the second finest harbor there is anywhere.

That is the right sort of book to publish. There is nothing vague, nor indefinite nor yet inaccurate about the information it gives. It errs, if at all, in being a trifle too modest. Victoria, is indeed one of the most beautiful cities in the world, but that is not all one can say about it. It is the capital of British Columbia and as such is the centre of the province's recreational, industrial, and social activities and that's saying a whole lot. Then there's Vancouver. Look at its bathing beach. No wonder the citizens have built the second finest harbor in the world when they have a great and beautiful slah of the Pacific Ocean to fling themselves and each other into to revive their weary bodies and minds whenever the business of operating their famous harbor becomes burdensome.

These two cities are linked with each other and with Seattle, to the south, by what is known as the Triangle Route of steamships of the Princess Kathleen, of the Canadian Pacific Coastal service is a member. The "Kathleen" recently made her inaugural trip on this route and is now permanently in the service.
