

# **SLEEPING SICKNESS**

## Canada's Heavyweight Champion Was III But Four Weeks.

Windsor, Feb. 18.—Canadian Press.— Arthur Pelkey, heavyweight champion of Canada, once looked on as one of the foremost "white hopes" for the world's title, and famous as the man who killed Luther McCarthy in the ring in Calgary some years ago, died this morning at his home in Ford City, Ont., after about four weeks' lilness from sleeping sick-ness.

BIG BUSINESS ON C. P. R. Despite the generally alleged business slump the C. P.
