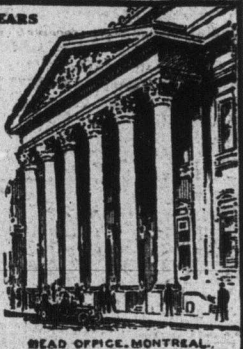

## Tariff Changes] Were Agreed On

7 1/2 PER CENT. TAKEN OFF COTTON SEED OIL AND VELVET

OTTAWA, June 25.—Parliament is grinding steadily away at its legislative program, and if the present rate of progress is continued prorogation by July 5 is possible. The budget proposals were finally disposed of today.

The only amendment was one moved by the Opposition, to put oil for asphalt on the free list. It was proposed by Mr. Joseph Archambault, who claimed that to put oil on the free list would encourage the good roads movement. Sir Thomas White's reply might be summed up in the phrase, "We need the money." The House evidently agreed with him, as he had the overwhelming majority of 59.

Suggestions were made by James Robb and Hon. Rodolph Lemieux, that flour milling machinery and milling requirements, including leather belting and bags, as well as mining machinery, should be put on the free list.

He also held that while wheat had been placed on the free list there was a duty on bran and shorts, although they were going into the United States free. This, Mr. Robb said, was not in the interest of dairying in Canada.

Not Pressed  
Sir Thomas White suggested that these questions should be left over until the general tariff revision. They did not demur and the proposals were not pressed.

Sir Thomas White proposed one amendment, which was accepted by the House. He proposed that the 7 1/2 per cent. be taken off cottonseed oil and velvet for cheap fabric used in the manufacture of clothing. He explained that as the duty had been removed off finished fabrics it had been decided to remove it from the raw materials.

Third reading was given to the bill to amend the Canada Shipping Act.

### OPPOSES BILL TO PREVENT CANADIAN SHIPS BEING TRANSFERRED TO ENEMY WITHOUT AUTHORITY

OTTAWA, June 24.—In the Commons today the second reading was given to Hon. C.C. Ballantyne's bill to amend the Canada Shipping Act, and the House went into committee on the bill, which stage it later passed. Mr. Ballantyne explained that the purpose of the bill was to prevent Canadian shipping falling into the hands of enemy nations. It provided that no transfer of a Canadian vessel or of a mortgage on a Canadian ship could take place without the authority of the marine department.

Dr. Michael Clerk wanted to know how it would be possible to get indemnities from enemy countries unless they were allowed shipping facilities. He would be signed and then war measures such as this bill should be unnecessary.

The Minister of Marine remarked that Great Britain has passed a bill practically the same as the one under discussion. Personally he would be strongly opposed to granting any application for shipping from Germany, Austria or Hungary.

Dr. Clark said that he believed in intimating England when she said good things, but not when she made mistakes. He did not want to see any bill passed which was going to perpetuate hatred and jealousy. He regarded the bill before the House as of that nature.

The bill passed committee stage and stands for third reading. The House then resumed consideration of the patent medicine bill, which was given third reading.

### WHITLEY SCHEME, HOWEVER, NOT RECOMMENDED FOR CANADA

OTTAWA, June 23.—The report of the committee on industrial relations will be in the hands of the Government tomorrow or Thursday. It is understood that the recommendation will be unanimous, a fact in itself regarded as significant. The board will recommend certain legislation to improve the relations between capital and labor.

There will be subscription to the principle of collective bargaining, as defined by the railway orders.

The Whitley plan, for the representation of labor in industrial management, is understood to be charged as unsuited to Canada, but something approaching that system, suitable to this country, will be favored. The committee is making a number of important recommendations to the Government, and is suggesting immediate action by legislation. The report attempts a definition as practical between the railroad brotherhoods and the companies.

The commission found that owing to the enormous distances in Canada, and varying condition in each province, it is difficult to apply the plan as laid down by the Whitley report for England.

The Whitley report provided for the appointment of a joint standing industrial council in each important industry.

Cultivation and Drainage Pays
