

Society. The President, Vice Presidents and Secretary and Treasurer shall constitute an Executive Committee to provide for the general interest of the Union.

*Article V.* This Society shall hold meetings at such times and places as shall be determined by the Executive Committee. The President may call special meetings of the Executive Committee when he may deem it necessary.

*Article VI.* The duties of the President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer shall be the duties usually pertaining to these offices.

*Article VII.* This Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of all the Active Members present at any regular meeting, the amendment having been submitted in writing and notice having been given at least four weeks before action is taken.

### **Relation of The United Society, State Unions and the Local Unions.**

The relation of the United Society and the State and Local Unions to each other has been thus defined by the Trustees of the United Society.

"The Local Societies are for Christian Endeavor work in the churches with which they are connected. The Local Unions are for mutual helpfulness between the neighboring societies of the same city or district. The State Unions are for the spread of the work in the State where they are formed, and the Annual Conventions are especially for the discussion of methods of work. The United Society, as the incorporated body, is the proper organization for the raising of money, and the publication of literature, and for the general management of the work at large. For the sake of unity, and of securing suitable supervision of the literature and the workers for whom the Society is responsible, it is expedient that the literature and the paid representatives emanate from the United Society."
