The House accordingly resolved itself into the said Committee, and, after some time spent therein, Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair; and Mr. *Daly* reported, That the Committee had gone through the Bill, and directed him to report the same without any amendment.

*Ordered*, That the Clerk do carry the Bill to the Senate, and desire their concurrence.

The Order of the Day being read, for the second reading of the Bill to authorize the raising, by way of Loan, of certain moneys required for the Public Service;

Mr. *White (Renfrew)* reported from the Committee of Supply, several Resolutions; which were read, as follow:—

1. *Resolved*, That a sum not exceeding One thousand four hundred dollars be granted to Her Majesty, to provide for the salary of one 1st Class Clerk, Post Office Department, for the year ending 30th June, 1885.

2. *Resolved*, That a sum not exceeding Four hundred and seventy-five dollars be granted to Her Majesty, to pay to the undermentioned Clerks the amounts granted under the provisions of an Order in Council of the 15th February last, being \$50 for each and every optional subject passed by them at the examination of the Civil Service Board, viz.: Privy Council—*L. H. Chute*, \$25; Post Office Department—*E. F. Taylor*, \$50; *H. P. W. Chesley*, \$100; *E. F. Jarvis*, \$100; *A. Geddes*, \$50; *W. E. C. Stewart*, \$50; *F. E. S. Grout*, \$100, for the year ending 30th June, 1885.

3. *Resolved*, That a sum not exceeding One thousand two hundred and fifty dollars be granted to Her Majesty, to defray the following expenses in connection with the Senate:—To provide for increase of salary of the Law Clerk, Master in Chancery, Clerk of Committees, and English Translator, \$200; Second Clerk Assistant, Master in Chancery, and Chief French Translator, \$300; First French Translator and Clerk, \$300; Clerk of French Journals and Assistant Sergeant-at-Arms, \$200; Assistant Accountant and Junior Clerk, \$50; Junior Clerk, \$50; Bank Messenger, \$50; *Less*—Reduction of salaries: Assistant Accountant, \$400; Assistant Clerk of Private Bills and Clerk, \$200,—\$600=\$550; To provide for salary of one Messenger, unprovided for in main Estimate, \$600; Postage and carriage of Mails, unprovided for in main Estimate, \$100, for the year ending 30th June, 1885.

4. *Resolved*, That a sum not exceeding Four hundred and ten thousand dollars be granted to Her Majesty, to defray the following expenses in connection with the Intercolonial Railway:—To reimburse the Government of *New Brunswick* for money expended by them on the construction of the section of Railway between *Painsec*
