It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill with several amendments to which they desire their concurrence.

The Honorable Mr. Mitchell presented to the House the Annual Report of the Department of Marine and Fisheries.

Ordered, That the same do lie on the Table, and it is as follows:

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Mitchell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Campbell, it was

Ordered, That the said Report be referred to the Joint Committee of the Senate and House of Commons on the Printing of Parliament.

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk, to return the Bill intituled: "An Act respecting Insolvency."

And also the Bill intituled: "An Act respecting malicious injuries to property," and to acquaint this House that they have agreed to the amendments made to the said Bills without any amendment.

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk, to return the Bill intituled: "An Act respecting Inquiries and Investigations into Shipwreeks and other matters."

Also the Bill intituled: "An Act respecting Contagious Diseases affecting Animals."

And also the Bill intituled: "An Act to remove doubts as to Legislation in Canada "regarding offences not wholly committed within its limits," and to acquaint this House that they have passed the said Bills without any amendment.

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk, with a Bill intituled: "An Act to provide means for improving the Harbors and Channels at certain Ports in the Provinces of the Dominion" to which they desire the concurrence of this House.

The said Bill was read for the first time.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Mitchell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Campbell, it was

Ordered, That the Forty-second Rule of this House be dispensed with in so far as it relates to the said Bill, and that the same be read a second time presently.

The said Bill was read a second time accordingly.

Ordered, That the said Bill be committed to a Committee of the Whole House presently.

The House according to Order was adjourned during pleasure, and put into a Committee of the Whole on the said Bill.

After some time the House was resumed, and

The Honorable Mr. Kenny, from the said Committee, reported that they had gone through the said Bill, and had directed him to report the same to the House, without any amendment.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. Mitchell, seconded by the Honorable Mr. Campbell, it was

Ordered, That the said Bill be read a third time presently.

The said Bill was then read a third time accordingly.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill without any amendment.

A Message was brought from the House of Commons by their Clerk to return the Bill intituled: "An Act respecting Larceny and other similar offences."
