A Men's Declaration Against Violence will be launched by a member of the family violence research centre and signed by a male student. Lorraine Whalley, director of the Fredericton Sexual Assault Centre, will read statistics about violence against women across Canada. The vigil will conclude with a blessing ceremony from a representative of the Fredericton Native community.
