No injury occurred. A stage show, "Capitel Capers" was presented by the Canadian Legion War Services in the Recreation Hall. Smaller attendance than usual due to some personnel being away on Easter Leave.
	23rd Apr.1943		Good Friday. Regular flying was carried out, but a 2-minute silence was observed by all at 11 AM, while "Last Post" and "Reveille" were sounded by selected buglers.
