Ottawa, Aug. 20, 1908.

Sir,-

With reference to your security bond for \$730 dated June 11, 1884, as Indian Agent for part of the province of New Brunswick, I beg to inform you that it in considered advisable in the case of any bond that has been in existence for about ten years to ascertain whether both the sureties are still living, and, if so, what are their present post office addresses.

On April 3, 1897, you were asked to supply the information indicated above; and on the 5th of that month you replied that your sureties were both living and that Fredericton was their post office address.

As a period of ten years has elapsed since the Department made inquiry in this matter, I have to request that you will be good enough to say at your convenience whether both your bondsmen are still living and what are their present post office addresses.
