Sir:-

I shall be glad to receive from you a list of all the Reserves, as known to you, which belong to your Agency. The following is the list as shown by Departmental records:-

Alkali Lake, Alexandria, Canim Lake, Canoe Lake, Soda Creek, Quesnel, Williams Lake, Cayoosh Nos. 1 & 2, Fountain, Bridge River, Pavilion, Anderson Lake, Seton Lake comprising (Seton Lake, Nicait and Mission), Anaham, Stone Toosey, Red Stone, Nemiah Valley and Dog Creek.

When sending in your Census return you omitted to forward returns of census for the following reserves:-

Cayoosh Nos. 1 & 2, Fountain, Bridge River, Pavilion, Anderson Lake, Seton Lake comprising (Nicait, Seton Lake and Mission).

In your return for 1911, you show the divisions Seton Lake as Nicait, Seton Lake and Mission, while in 1912 you gave Schloss No. 5 as one of the divisions instead of Mission. Is this Band known by the name of Mission and a Schloss?

Dog Creek which was shown in your 1910 return was not reported on in 1911, but appears in your 1912 return with a population of 20 Indians.

The boundaries of the Williams Lake Agency remain
