Ottawa, 22nd. March, 1916.

Sir:-

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your report for February which you submitted from the Victoria Hospital; and in reply I may say that it is observed therefrom that three patients, Minnie Big Bull, Emma Wolftail and Annie Sarcesman, who are suffering from tubercular glands have been in the hospital for nearly two years, while certain other patients suffering from the same disease have been in the institution for about a year. Under the circumstances the Department desires that you will request the selaried medical officer to make a report on these cases. The Department desires to have him state what is the prospect of ultimate recovery and how long it is likely that each child will have to be under treatment. I may add that it is observed that the doctor has not signed the last two reports (January and February) received from the Victoria Hospital. You should be particular to see that these reports are signed by the doctor xx sefore they are transmitted to the Department.
