It is on the line of the Missisquoi & Black River Railway, 10 miles only of which are built, i. e., from Eastman to Bolton Centre. This is operated for freighting purposes by the C. V. R. There are two Sawmills, one Tub Factory, two General Stores, two Churches and two Schools. The Eureka Card Co. also have their works here. Population 250. Distance from Knowlton, 8 miles; Bolton Springs, 4 miles; Knowlton Landing $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles; Eastman, 8 miles.
