### HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Territories, excepting 8 and 56, which has not been homesteaded, or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any part of the section of 180 areas, and the sole heart of the section of 180 areas, more or less, and the section of 180 areas, more or less.

#### ENTRY.

#### HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the followire plans:—

(1) At least six months' residence tipe" and ultivation of the land in each year during the erm of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is deceased) or any person who is slightle to make a homested entry the provisions of this consistency of the father in the result of the father in the result of the father in the requirements of this Act as to gradence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If r settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in abbained secretic second homestead, the requirements this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is not be violity of the first second by the second homestead is not be violity of the first.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2)(3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 30 head of stock with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

### APPLICATION FOR PATENT
