## THE CAPTURE OF JERICHO

Joshua 6: 8-20-Memory Verse, 20.

Golden Text-By faith the walls of Jericho fell down, after they were compassed about seven days.-Hebrews 11: 30.



8 And it came to pass, when Josh'ua had spoken unto the people, that the seven priests bearing the seven trumpets of rams' horns passed on before the Long, and blew with the trumpets : and the ark of the covenant of the Long followed them. 9 And the armed men went before the priests that blew with the trumpets, and the rereward came after

19 But all the silver, and gold, and vessels of brass and iron, are consecrated unto the Lorob : they shall come into the transpet, and the pricets blew with the trumpets : and it came to pass, when the people heard the sound of the trumpet, and the people shouted with a great shout, that the wall fell down flat, so that the people went up into the city, every man straight before him, and they took the city.

## THE LESSON RETOLD

The first city that the children of Israel came to in the land of Canaan was called Jericho. It had a high, strong wall built all around it; but the Israelites were not afraid to fight against the city, for God had promised to be with them to help them. It was the people of Jericho who were afraid, for they had heard of some of the wonders which the God of Israel had done and had shut up the gates of their city, and would not let any one go out or come in.

Then the Lord spoke to Joshua and told him the strange way in which the Israelites were to take the city. They were to march round the city once every day for six days ; and the priests were to carry the ark with them. Seven priests were to go before the ark, blowing upon trumpets. On the seventh day, the Israelites were to march round Jericho seven times, and the priests were still to blow their trumpets. Then, when the people heard them blow a long blast, they were to give a great shout, and the walls of the city would tumble down, and they could then go in and take possession of it.

So Joshua called the people together, and told them what God had commanded them to do. On the morning of the first day the procession started round the city. A company of armed men led the way. Next came the seven priests blowing upon their trumpets. After these followed the priests bearing the ark, and last came another company of men. And so the great procession marched round the city of Jericho, but, except for the priests who were blowing the trumpets, the people were very quiet, for Joshua had said that they were not to speak or make any noise until he told them to do so. Then, when they had gone once round the city,
