THE IRISH LAND BILL.

LONDON, April 6th.—It is expected that Gladstone's speech introducing the Land Bill in the Commons tomorrow will occupy three hours. It is anticipated that the Bill will provide under the head "Sale of Tenures," that every tenancy shall first be offered to the landlord, and the landlord may prohibit the sale of the tenancy where reasonable grounds exist. The question what are reasonable grounds, may be referred to a Land Court. Where the landlord proposes to raise the rent to the purchasing tenant, the latter may resist, and shall be entitled to demand from the landlord capitalization equal to ten times the amount of increase demanded. Sale of tenancy bars claim to compensation for disturbance or improvements, and the receipt of such compensation bars the right of sale. Where the tenant deviates the interest to his children or other persons, only one of the devisees shall occupy the tenancy, the object being to prevent subdivision contrary to the wish of the landlord. When the tenant accepts the increased rent proposed by the landlord the tenant may not be disturbed for fifteen years during which period there shall be no eventual compulsory increase of rate, except as a consequence of breach of certain statutory conditions; if the tenant declines the proposed increase and quits, he shall, if he sells the holding, be entitled from the landlord to ten times the amount demanded as an increase. The statutory conditions which bind the tenant as above, are a punctual payment of rent, a guarantee against waste, submission to the ordinary rights of inspection, shooting, etc., and prohibition to sub-let or divide without the written permission of the landlord. The limitation in the Land Act of 1870, of compensation for disturbance, to £250, will be replaced by a sliding scale. Where the rent is under thirty pounds compensation will be seven years' rent; where the rent is under fifty pounds, not exceeding five years' rent; where the rent is £50 and upwards, not exceeding three years.

The Act of 1870 will be further amended to fully protect the tenants' right for compensation for improvement where the tenant submits to the new tenant, at the landlord's wish or takes a different holding. The Act of 18.0, relating to compensation for improvements or evictions by title paramount, is affirmed. GOV. SEYMOUR ON THE IRISH.

In an interview of a *Herald* reporter with Governor Seymour, that great and good man said in answer to the question: "What is your opinion of the Irish as a component of American population? Are they not rapidly becoming farmers in New York as in New England?"

"It is not just to say that legislation is necessary because of the faults of the Irish landlords. They have stood the trial, and, as rule, been acquitted, though the proceedings of a limited number of them have been arbitrary, harsh and cruel. This is partly, but not solely, the reason for the necessity of the legislation we are about to introduce. Gladstone then referred to the partial failure of the Land Act of 1870, which he attributed mainly, though not wholly to amendments the Government had disapproved. He reviewed the reports of the Richmond and Bessborough Commissions, of which notwithstanding the conferring of the recommendations had been of the greatest service to the Government. The Bessborough Commission, with one dissenter, and the Bessborough Commission unanimously agreed in recommending the establishment of a court to deal with the difference between landlord and tenant regarding rent. The two great questions to be dealt with are, first, the relations between landlord and tenant in Ireland; and, second, the advances from the public exchequer. He declared that never as a Minister had he submitted any measure with a greater sense of the enormous moment of the topic and its position involved. Nothing that can be legitimately done or said by the Government for the promotion of legislation shall we hesitate to do to procure the passing of the system and wreck the constitution.
