PATENTS.

CAN I OBTAIN A PATENT?

Send a rough sketch or (if you can) a model of your invention to GEORGE E. LEMON, Washington, D. C., and a Preliminary Examination will be made of all United States patents of the same class of inventions and you will be advised whether or not a patent can be obtained.

FOR THIS PRELIMINARY EXAMINATION NO CHARGE IS MADE.

What will a Patent Cost?

If you are advised that your invention is patentable, send \$50 to pay Government application fee of \$15, and \$5 for the drawings required by the Government. This is payable when application is made, and is all of the expense unless a patent is allowed. When allowed, the attorney's fee (\$25) and the final Government fee (\$20) is payable. Thus you know beforehand, for nothing, whether you are going to get a patent or not, and no attorney's fee is charged unless you do get a Patent. An attorney whose fee depends on his success in obtaining a Patent will not advise you that your invention is patentable, unless it really is patentable, so far as his judgment can aid in determining the question; hence, you can rely on the advice given after a preliminary examination is had. Design Patents and the Registration of Labels, Trade Marks and Re-issues secured. Caveats prepared and filed. Applications in review of Rejected, Abandoned, or Forfeited Cases made. Very often valuable inventions are saved in these classes of cases. If you have undertaken to secure your own patent and failed, a skillful handling of the case may lead to success. Send me a written request addressed to the Commissioner of Patents that he recognize GEORGE E. LEMON, of Washington, D. C., as your attorney in the case, giving the title of the invention and about the date of filing your application. An examination and report will cost you nothing.
