ORDERED, that Mr. Papineau, fenior, Mr. Dénéchau, Mr. Robitaille, Mr. Coffin, and Mr. Bell, do compose the said Committee.

Mr. Dénéchau, from the Committee of the whole House to whom was referred the Bill for erecting a Common Gaol in the District of Three Rivers, and to provide the means for defraying the expenses thereof, reported, according to order, the amendments made by the Committee to the Bill; and he read the report in his place, and afterwards delivered it, with the Bill, in at the Clerk's Table, where the amendments were read once throughout.

On motion of Mr. Coffin, seconded by Mr. Bruneau;

ORDERED, that the question of concurrence be put on Friday next, upon the said amendments.

Mr. Coffin, accompanied by the other Messengers, reported to the House, that their Address of Monday last, to His Excellency the Governor in Chief, praying he would be pleased to order the proper Officers to lay before the House the Process Verbal, Plans and Papers, relating to a Bridge to be built over the River Montmorency, had been presented to His Excellency, and that he had been pleased to return for answer, that he will give directions accordingly.

The other orders of the day being read;

On motion of Mr. Lee, seconded by Mr. Robitaille:

ORDERED, that the faid orders of the day be postponed.

Resolved, that this House will, on Monday next, resolve itself into a Committee of the whole House, on the Bill for erecting a Bridge over the River Montmorency, and to provide the means for defraying the expenses and maintenance thereof, and on the amendments reported by a Special Committee to the said Bill.
