## LIVE STOCK MARKETS

The run of live stock at the cattle market was light, 44 carloads of told, comprising 8877 hogs, 100 cattle, 685 sheep, 8 calves and 1100 turkeys.

Trade was much the same as on Thursday for all classes, with prices

Export cattle-Choice lots of export cattle sold at \$4.75 to \$5.00 per cwt, while lights sold at \$4 25 to \$4 50.

Bulls-Heavy export sold at \$3 80 to \$4 75 per cwt, while light export sold at \$3 25 to \$3 50 per cwt.

Load of good butchers' and exporters, mired, sold at \$3 871 to \$4 121 per

Butchers' cattle-Choice picked lots of butchers' cattle, equal in quality to the best exporters, weighing 1000 to. 1100 lbs each, sold at \$4 25 to \$4 40.

Loads of good butchers' cattle sold at \$3 70 to \$4, and medium butchers', mixed cows, heifers and steers, \$3 40 to \$3 60 per ewt.

Common butchers' cattle sold at \$3 10 to \$3 30, while inferior sold at \$2 60

Heavy feeders -- Choice, well-bred steers, weighing from 1050 to 1260 lbs each, were scarce, with prices firm at \$3 75 to \$3 85, and \$4 was paid for a few short keepers.

Rough steers of the same weight sold at \$3 40 to \$3 60 per cwt.

Light feeders-Steers, weighing 800 to 900 lbs each, were selling at \$3 20 to \$3 40 per cwt.

Feeding bulls-Bulls for the byres sold at \$2 75 to \$3 per cwt.

Buffalo stockers-Yearling steers, 500 to 600 ibs in weight, are easy at . \$2 60 to \$2 75, while heifers and black and white steers of the same weight sold at \$2 to \$2 60 per cwt.

Milch cows-There were about 11 cows and springers offered. Prices were firm, ranging all the way from \$30

Calves-About 20 calves sold at \$4

Sheep-Prices firm, at \$8 to \$8 40 per cwt for ewes, and bucks at \$250, butchers' shoep at \$2 to \$2 50 each.

Lambs-Prices \$3 50 \$4 per cwt, with a few choice lots of ewes and wethers for export at \$4 25 to \$4 40 per cwt.

Hogs-Deliveries heavy, 3877, with prices steady. Best select bacon hors weighting not less that 160 nor more 200 ibs cach, unfed and unwatered (off cars), sold at \$4 50; thick fats at \$4, and lights at \$4 12½ per cwt.
