Cross Work at Front.

A farewell reception was tendered Dr. C. W. Woodall last night by the members of the Y.M.C.A. at the home of Dr. H. MacDonald, president grand master. Dr. Woodall recently joined the Red Cross and will leave for the front in the near future. A pleasing program was rendered Dr. F. J. MacDonald, poet and past grand master of the association recited several original verses written especially for the occasion. A. L. Pauze, grand narrator, was the next on the program followed by Dr. R. K. Rosenberger who gave several vocal selections. The official quartette composed of J. R. Schermerhorn, Dr. Joseph Garlick, Dr. A. Grusser and Maurice Katz next gave several selections.

Attorney H. E. Blodgett presented Dr. Woodall with a handsome diamond ring and expressed the regrets of the association on losing one of its most prominent members. Many professional and business men of the city attended the reception.

As soon as the United States declared war on Germany Dr. Woodall offered his services and was the first person in his city to receive a commission from Washington.
