To the Electors of the Yukon-A Straight Forward Manly Statement.

Vancouver, Sept. 22.-Hon. James Hamilton-Ross has authorized the following address to be issued: To the Electors of the Yukon Terri-

tory :-Gentlemen,-I have learned by telegram that numerous requisitions havebeen signed and forwarded to me desiring me to become a candidate for the seat in the house of commons recently assigned to the Yukon, and that a convention of thoroughly representative people has unanimously nominated me as such candidate. I have in consequence resolved to tender my resignation of the office of commissioner of the Yukon Territory and to ask you for your support in the coming election.

I have lived in your midst for over a year and have become personally acquainted with many of you. My administration of office is before you. That it has not been wholly free from error I frankly admit. It has certainly been to the best of my ability and with the sincere desire of advancing your interests. I have by reason of my relation with the territory become acquainted with its affairs and requirements and believe that this act as well as my many years experience in public affairs in the West may enable me to be of greater service to you as your repreentative than one could possibly be who is without such experience. CHILDREN KEPT HOME

Must Not be on Streets After 9 O'Clock

Bylaw Passed Last Night by the City Council one of Excellent Purpose.

Eastern people reading in the Daw-'son papers the account of the deliberations of the city council will doubtless be somewhat amazed at a bylaw having been enacted which forbids the presence of children on the streets after 9 o'clock in the evening, The action of the council last night in passing such an ordinance was largely due to a request made by Chief of Police Smith who stated in a communication to the council that some steps were needed to keep many of the irresponsible youths of the city at home in their proper places. Some of them combine in their diminutive bodies the very quintessence of cussedness, are impertinent, full of mischief; swear like a pirate, and a few of them will not stop at petty thieving if a good opportunity presents itself. Pop, fruit and other articles displayed in the front of many of the stores are their principal graft and their boldness is so great that they have become a nuisance. It is to remedy the evil and prevent if possible some of them landing in jail that the bylaw was passed. The bill is short and concise, but it will inspire terror in the hearts of the young evil-doers if it is enforced. Its provisions are as follows: No person under the age of twelve
