PHILADELPHIA, Sept. 16.—The hurricane which swept the Windward islands, Saturday, 1st was encountered, on Sunday morning, by the Norwegian bark Avana, which arrived at this port yesterday. Captain Frostad, the master of the Avons, states that there were barometer indications before the storm struck the vessel and he was, therefore not unprepared to meet it, but it was necessary to heave the vessel to avoid serious consequences. After that the hurricane raged with renewed vigor. Captain Frostad believes that many vessels foundered and will never be heard from.


