Summer Dresses. A quaint effect is given garden party dresses by allowing bits of color that would be out of place in any other costume. Leghorns fashions profusely with flowers are fashionably worn. The patterns are of lace or tulle, sometimes ornamented with bunches of flowers. Lovely dresses are made of sprigged and plover laces, with silk foundations in pale blue, pink, light green, yellow or white. The skirt is full and double draped on each side, after the fashion of thirty years ago, the surplus, round waist and puffed sleeves are finished with a dog collar and wristbands of colored ribbon, and an empire sash to match. Muslins striped with Valenciennes inserting are made in the same manner, with a large hat of the material trimmed with a wreath of roses or daisies, and a lace trimmed parasol of the dress fabric. White toilets are very fashionable this season, and colored sashes are sometimes worn, although white is more girlish and stylish. A floral bouquet or ribbon is placed on the parasol to complete the desired uniformity of the costume. A pretty dress was recently made for a garden party, with skirt of white lace over which was a Directoire polonaise in pompadour striped silk. Another stylish dress was draped with lace in Marie Antoinette fashion and apron front. A lovely dress shows the skirt plain and full of fine Swiss embroidered flouncing and Empire waist and long panier drapery of lace or striped silk, over which is one of embroidered silk muslin. The basque is of muslin, with short wide revers of the silk, lace ruffles over the wrist and a Louis XV. cravat of lace and silk muslin. A silk gown is draped with a large hat of the material trimmed with a wreath of roses or daisies, and the round waist has French sleeves.

Dr Sivartia, of Chicago, is organizing a movement for the resettlement of Palestine. He is working in England as well as in America. He is making many converts to his view, and he expects that there will soon be an extensive migration to the Holy Land from both Europe and America. The new colony, although the product of deep religious convictions, is to be formed on strictly business principles. Captain Condar, who has made an official survey of Palestine, reports that its agricultural capabilities are very great and that it can be easily made to rival in fertility the most productive countries of Southern Europe. Plans have formed to rebuild Jerusalem in harmony with the prophetic descriptions of the Bible. It is proposed to be made a center of learning and political influence as well as of religion. Dr Sivartia's scheme is extensive and far-reaching. He says that he has long wanted to break the contract and start on Palestine but all the great Euphrates Valley, "which is capable of sustaining 100,000,000 people, and of again being the center of the world's activities." He expects aid both from Jews and Christians. According to his expectations the Jews will send out one-sixth of the population of the rehabilitated and revived Holy Land. Dr Sivartia is evidently an enthusiast, who has the faculty of inoculating others with his enthusiasm.
