Sir Charles Monro, the New Dardanelles Commander.

mander-in-Chief in the Dardanelles. General Sir Charles C. Monro, might have lived and died plain Major-General Monro, unknown to the man in the street and known only in the army as a very efficient instructor and commandant at Hythe School of Mus-

When the war broke out he had been five years a Major-General. The day after war was declared he was appointed a divisional commander, and in a short time was out in France trying to stem the amazing rush of

the German troops towards Paris.

Mentioned in Despatches. What he did is only known in all its fullness to Sir John French. Planning, organizing, fighting, Monro never rested day or night during those dreadful days of last year when hope seemed lost. He was one of the men who, on September 6th, began to stem the German torrent, fought in the battle of the Aine-and saved Eu-

For that he was mentioned in Sir John French's dispatches of the battle of the Aisne, promoted to lieutenant-general, and then to full general, and in February of this year made a K. C. B. "for services rendered in connection with operations in the field." as the bald official announcement

states it. One of the causes which have enabled the Germans to fight so well. and the Turks to hold on to the Dardanelles, is the huge supply of machine

guns which they possess. Sir Charles Monro is one of the chief machine-gun experts in the British Army. For six years he was at the Hythe School of Musketry as Chief Instructor and Commandant. The Hythe School is the chief school for the training of officers and non-com-
