Blood Pressure Victims Say New Liver Extract Gives Complete Relief

Business Man in Danger of Second
Stroke Returns to Work After
Treatment and Is Able to Drive His
Own Motor.

Four patients suffering from high
blood pressure who have been treated
by Dr. W. J. Macdonald with liver
extract for the control of this con-
dition were interviewed by The Star
and gave convincing testimony to the
efficacy of the extract. One of these
patients has taken no injections for a
month, and his blood pressure has
remained normal.

"I don't need to tell people that I
am greatly improved," he said to The
Star. "They can see that for them-
selves. They stop me on the street
and say, 'you're looking well, what
have you been doing?'"

This man, who is over sixty years
of age, appears to be in normal health
at the present time, although seven
years ago he sustained a paralytic
stroke which affected part of his body
for some time.
"My left side was affected, and the
right side of my head felt as if it
would burst," he told The Star. "After
a rest of six months I gradually
improved and began to resume my
work. Some time early in the year I
met Dr. Macdonald. I was complain-
ing of being unwell and he took my
blood pressure, which proved to be
around 218, or 78 millimeters above
normal. He told me then that he was
working on this liver extract and I
agreed to take the treatments. I knew
I was going around all the time in
jeopardy of my life. I was perpetually
in the stroke zone of high blood
pressure. I might easily have been
dead from what I have come through."

Pressure Rapidly Fell.

Starting early in January he was
given injections daily of the extract,
and sometimes twice a day, for a
couple of weeks. His blood pressure
rapidly fell to normal. Altogether
he took three courses of the treat-
ment.

"Although I stopped all treatments
a month ago," he said, "my blood
pressure has remained down, and I
have felt free from all the former
depressing symptoms. I am actively
at work again. And I drive my own
car. I used to have to restrict my
diet, but now I am eating everything,
even meat."

Another one of the most hopeful
and optimistic people who have come
back to normal after years of depres-
sion and uncomfortable living is a
man who travelled from Akron, Ohio.
He is a jolly, grey-haired man of 56,
who in his younger days was noted
for his health and remarkable phys-
ique. He told of having baffled his
way back to life after an accident to
his head a few years ago, which drove
a piece of his skull on to the brain,
and made an operation for trepanning
a necessity.

He told of having become ill about
five months ago from high blood
pressure, so that he was entirely in-
capacitated for work.

"You know how your foot feels
when it is asleep," he said. "That's
just the sensation I had all the time
at the base of my skull. It seemed
as if my eyes were trying to bulge
out."

Impossible to Sleep

"I'm a pretty sound sleeper usual-
ly, but even that was being inter-
rupted. I wakened up in the morning,
also, with pains in my shoulders."

It was an interesting story of sheer
chance which made him acquainted
with Dr. Macdonald, and sent him all
the way from Akron to St. Cathar-
ine's a few weeks ago.

"About seven weeks ago," he said,
"my son and I went to visit my
daughter who lives in Indiana. I
