A convention of municipal representa-tives is now sitting in Toronto, to con-A convention of municipal representatives it now sitting in Toronto, to consider the provisions of the Assessment law, and suggest such considerations as might be desirable. The convention met in the City Hall on Tuesday, but nothing of importance was done, except a brief discussion on the question whether it would not be better to exempt personal property altogether, and the passage of a resolution to the effect that "all personal property should bear its fair burden of assessment." The Guelph representatives at the convention are the Mayor and Town Clark Mr. Elliott, who was also leading to the convention and the passage of a framewill. Mr. Elliott, who was also appointed a delegate by the Council, was not present at the Convention, he being detained in Guelph by important private business.

On Wednesday the Convention assem. bled at ten o'clock. After some discussion as to the manner in which the sections of the Assessment Act should be considered, it was resolved, on the motion of Mr. Holden (Belleville), that the 9th section should be first proceeded with, which says:—"All land and personal property in the Province of Ontario shall be liable to taxation, subject to certain

be liable to taxation, subject to certain exemptions."

The first exemption clause frees Government property and Indian reserves. It was moved and seconded that this should stand, and the motion was carried

It was moved and seconded that this should stand, and the motion was carried after a discussion.

The second clause of the exemptions was as follows:—"When any property mentioned in the preceding clause, number one, is occupied by any person otherwise than in an official canacity, the occupant shall be assessed in respect thereof but the property itself shall not be liable." Mr. Robertson, (Guelph) moved, seconded by Mr. McCormick (London,) that the clause stand. Carried.

The remainder of the forenoon session was occupied with a deba'e upon the next clause, which provided for exemption of "Every place of worship, and land used in connection therewith, churchyard or burying ground." A number of amendments were moved, amongst was one moved by Ald. Cronyn (London), and seconded by Mr. Harvey (Guelph), that the words "and land used in connection therewith" be struck out. This, with most of the other amendments, was withdrawn upon Mr. Holden moving that clause 3 of the exemptions read "Exempt buildings only, and not the land, which shall not apply to burial grounds." This motion was carried.

At the afternoon session the first resolution was "That clause 3 read also to exempt all lands set apart and used as burying-grounds, whether in connection with buildings used as places of worship or not."

The clause exempting educational in-itutions was voted against by the con-

A number of clauses were then allowed to stand, as follows:—Public roads; municipal property; the Provincial Penitentiary and land; the property of every industrial farm, poor-house, alms-house, orphan asylum, house of industry, and every lunatic asylum, and company for the reformation of offenders; the property of public, literary, and scientific institutions; the personal property and official income of the Governor-General of the Dominion of Canada, and the official income of the Lieutanant-Governor of the Province. nor of the Province
