His Lordship in charging the Grand Jury said he was happy to inform them that there were but two cases on the criminal calendar before him. One was rather of a serious character, the party accused having attempted to take the lives of two innocent parties. The other was that of bigamy. He explained fully the bearing of the law on these cases, and clearly pointed out to the jury what

was their duty in such matters. He also reminded the jury that there was a possibility of other cases coming up before the close of the Assizes, of the nature of what he was not then aware.

The jury then retired, and after a short session, brought in a true bill against Robert Craig for Malicious Libel.

In the meantime no civil cases were taken up, none of them being ready. The Court adjourned at about three o'clock.
