FRENCH NAVAL MARINES HAVE GONE ON STRIKE

Object to Competition With Arabs and Other Foreigners.

Marseilles, April 6.—The strike of naval reserves because of the employment on French liners of Arabs and others who are not French subjects, is causing serious inconvenience and financial loss. A score of ships bound for the Mediterranean ports, Africa, and the east are unable to sail. Six torpedo boats are assuming the service while naval marines are held in readiness to make up the quota of any crew in emergency.

This afternoon the maritime court sentenced ten striking firemen each to ten days imprisonment. The accused had declared that they left their ship because they feared violence.

M. G. Herron, under secretary of the navy, characterized the strike as not a labor struggle, but a revolutionary movement, started by a few agitators, who have terrorized the men.
