THE METHODIST NEW CONNEXION CHURCH IN LONDON, C. W.

From the Christian Messerget.

DEAR SIR,- It occurs to me that it would be acceptable to you, and to your readers, and, from the facts it narrates, a profi abie lesson to members of the various Methodist Bodies generally, to receive a brief report of the recent movement in this town atnong the members of the Methodist Churches, which have resulted in the organization of a Church of the Methodist New Connex. ion.

About three years since, and until the resent time, there were two commodious hapels in this town, one belonging to the nembers of the Canadian Conference Me. hodists, and the other to the British Wesevan Methodists. The Chapel of the atter had been built more recently, with great exertions of liberality, and by persons animated with an active zeal for the cause of the Gospel : their labours resulted in a prosperous Church.

In June, 1847. it pleased the Conferent. es of these two Bodies to unite these two distinct churches throughout Upper Canada, without consulting the members of either community, and without giving any notice of their intention for such an Union ; but, on the contrary, they concealed such intentions ; and when individual preachers were questioned on the prospect of Union. they denied that an Union was even contemplated.
