The Wonderful Confession of a Man Who Has Murdered Ten Children and Three Grandchildren.

Three Grandchildren.

New York Aug. 24.—The mails just in from Trujilo, by way of Panama, under date of July 25, bring details from the village of Lomos de Zamora, in the United States of Columbia, of a series of child murders committed by a peon named Marciano Medina. His wife and daughter, Remigia, are accessories to, if not accomplies in, the killing of thirteen infants.

Medina has made a full confession to the commissary of police. He says he killed his own ten children because he was too poor to support them, and killed his three grandchildren to hide his daughter's shame. He has, in spite of his wholesale infanticide, six sons and one daughter, and they all knew of his murders and deprecated them. But no complaint ever found its way to the police until July 13, when he went to the town to invoke their aid in bringing back his daughter, who had run away with a lover. Her muscular strength was valuable in his ranch, and he wanted her back. She was arrested, and in revenge toid of her parent's crime.

The old man's confession tells the various ways in which he murdered each one of the thirteen infants from 1859 to 1891. He

een infants from 1859 to 1891. He thilled them all when they were less than 5 months old, some of them but a few days old. Between 1874 and 1882 he raised the seven children he now has. Excavations made on Medina's ranch have disclosed the skeletons of several of the babies.
