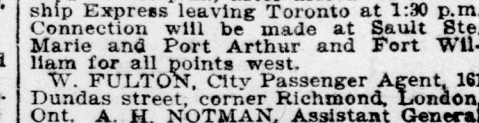

There are great numbers of beautiful paintings in almost every room of the house, and I noticed one in the library which I have just described, at least forty very fine oil paintings of various persons, and one, set in a frame of the ceiling, of some of the female members of the Lytton family.
