

LAURIER WILL TOUR ONTARIO

The Liberal Leader to Address Many Meetings Before Next Session.

WILL START IN AUGUST

Ottawa, June 19.—Sir Wilfrid Laurier intends to tour Ontario and Quebec and address a series of meetings in each province before the next session of Parliament opens. The meetings will probably begin during the latter part of August and continue during September. Sir Wilfrid will spend the next months at the capital and holidaying with friends, probably in the mountains of the New England States.

His residence at Arthursville is being enlarged and greatly improved this summer, and the Liberal leader hopes to spend quietly there a considerable part of the succeeding summer.

WATFORD MAN IS NOT GUILTY

Reeve Acquitted of the Charges Made in an Effort to Unseat Him.

WAS GIVEN A WARNING

[Canadian Press.] Toronto, June 19.—"The verdict on this charge will be 'not guilty,' but don't do it again," remarked Mr. Justice Riddell, with regard to a charge that Sanford Watford, reeve-elect of the Village of Watford, had an old debt to secure the vote of Mrs. Minnie Chapman.

His lordship dismissed the motion to unseat the reeve on quo warranto proceedings instituted by W. E. Fitzgerald. There were four grounds on which the election was attacked: two, that scrutineers had been paid to act for Mr. Watford, and had voted; one, that a debt had been paid because Mrs. Chapman had she would not vote until it was paid; and one, that the reeve-elect or his partner was interested in a contract with the corporation with respect to a postoffice site.

With regard to the scrutineers, it is held that they are not to be paid merely as scrutineers.

CHICAGO, June 19.—The run at the Union stockyards yesterday totaled 53 cars, with 499 cattle, 212 calves, 1,885 hogs and 387 sheep. The market today remained practically unchanged, there being only a fair demand for good cattle, and very little for heavy stock. Calves, sheep and small stuff remained firm, practically all offerings being snapped up. Hogs continued firm at yesterday's advanced prices. A review of the week shows a slow market for heavy cattle, and many good cattle going at sacrifice prices. Calves and sheep have remained very steady throughout the past two weeks, and present conditions indicate another firm trade next week. The hog trade opened easy on Tuesday, but the following day advanced from 5c to 10c, and held that price to the close. There have been some very large shipments of hogs during the past two markets, and the supply has been in excess of the demand. Dealers predict a big drop in this market next week, some going as far as to say that the opening of the week will be 50c less than this week's closing for all classes and 1c less for all over 220 lbs. If grass-fed cattle are not shipped in large quantities next week's market should experience no further decrease, but become firmer towards the close. This, however, depends entirely upon the producers. Maniac With Pistols Loose in Schoolroom

[Canadian Press.] Bremen, Germany, June 20.—A school teacher and two children were shot dead, another teacher and three children gravely wounded, and three other children slightly injured today by a former teacher named Schmidt, who, armed with six loaded revolvers, and carrying a quantity of extra cartridges, entered a Catholic school and started a fusillade among the class.

The man, who was apparently demented, was overcome and arrested by people attracted to the scene by the reports of firing. He refused an explanation of his action.


