City of Kitchener PAY YOUR TAXES

The second instalment of Taxes for 1918, due the Corporation of the City of Kitchener, will be received at the Tax Collector's office at the City Hall, on any business day up to September 28th, between the hours of nine a.m. and four p.m., and from September 28th to October 4th, inclusive, between the hours of nine a.m. and five p.m., and on the evening of the last day, and the evening preceding the last date of payment between the hours of seven p.m. and nine p.m.

All cheques tendered in payment of taxes, must be marked good by the Bank, and payable at par, Kitchener. To avoid errors, it is the wish not to wait for payment of taxes until the last few days.
