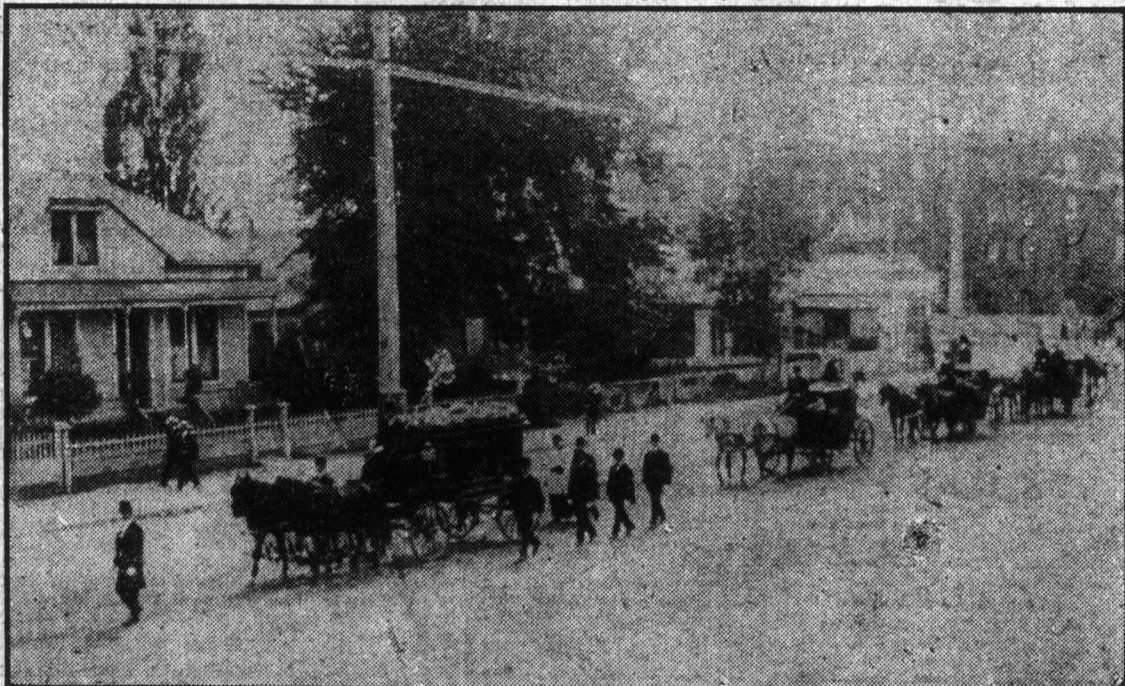


MANY SHOW RESPECT TO THE LATE TRAINER
