Trade has not developed any particularly new features during the week. In some lines the volume shows a slight falling off. This particularly applies to drygoods and hardware. HIDES AND SKINS. Hides and sheepskins are in good demand at unchanged prices. There appears to be a little stiffening in the price of calfskins.

DRUGS. Trade is more active, with payments fair. he tendency of prices is towards more rmness, but no actual change is reported. pium, morphia, bromide and iodide of otash are all firmer. Sundries are in active smand for the Christmas trade.

BOOTS AND SHOES. The weather continues favorable for the boot and shoe trade and the volume of business shows a further increase. The demand for coarse goods and rubbers is particularly brisk. Travelers are doing fairly well and payments are reported to be better than the average for this time of the year. Stocks of silver bullion in New York ar now 1,270,503 ounces.

Trade is merely nominal. The mills are fully employed, with stocks generally sold out, and yet they will only buy from hand to mouth. "They are not anticipating their wants, and what I am afraid of," said one dealer. "is that the very low price of produce will lessen the purchasing power of the people." There is a little more enquiry from the United States for 10,000 pound lots, but at prices lower than holders seem willing to accept.

LEATHER. Trade is keeping remarkably good and the prospects are better than for some time. Sole leather is in good demand with stocks small. An improved demand is reported for splits, there being more enquiry both on English and eastern account. Heavy harness sells freely, with light dragy. Colored leathers are in good demand, and the tanners report plenty of orders. Some sole leather has been sent abroad, but at prices too low to encourage

beavy shipments.

Trade has been quiet during the week, as is usual at this time of the year. The list has been somewhat changed in iron wire, the discount having been increased. The ingot tin market is easier. Tin plate firmer and manufacturers have advanced prices a shade. Copper is unchanged, and no large sales are reported. The feature of the trade is the activity in skates. The movement in shelf hardware is confined to small sorting-up parcels.


