Mixed Jury Secured After Two Hours Work-The Embalming Fluid Found at the Grave at Port Rope Ordered to Be Analyzed-Hooper Very Confident

JOLIETTE, Que., Jan. 3 .- The trial of John Reginald Hooper, for the murder of his wife, begins this afternoon. Many of the witnesses have arrived already and the pretty little town is the scene of considerable excitement. Judge De Lorimer, the Crown prosecutors and Ontario witnesses arrived at 11 o'clock this morning by a arrived at 11 o'clock this morning by a special train. Among the Ontario witnesses are Coroner Corbett from Port Hope, Drs. Corbett and Douglas, who made the post mortem examination; Dr. Clark of Rockwood Asylum, the undertaker, George, and Mrs. Cooper of Port Hope. The swearing in of the jurymen will likely take all afternoon, and in all probability the hearing of evidence will begin to morrow morning. It will be remembered that on Senti 18 Mrs. Hooper was taken suddenly Septi 18 Mrs. Hooper was taken suddenly ill on a railway train when near Terrebonne, and being taken off the train at that station expired a few minutes afterwards. The crown claims that the death was caused by prussic acid, administered to her by her husband. They will also try to prove that he threw her off a railway bridge at Louiseville and that she narrowly escaped drowning. The trial is expected to last about two weeks.

When Hooper was called to the dock he ascended the steps to it in a confident man-ner and nodded brightly to his lawyers. For a man wao is on trial for his life he certainly is showing remarkable confidence. Hooper was allowed to be seated during the
