to largely reduce the possible profits or even to cause failure to meet the running expenses of the farm. By preventing these wastes an unprofit-

able farm may often be made profitable.

Of late years efforts have been made to prevent grape juice fermenting and to preserve it in vessels of such size and shape as can easily be transported, thus rendering its use possible at all times of the year. Until recently its use has been almost exclusively restricted to medicinal or sacramental purposes. Unrestricted and general use has been retarded through lack of knowledge of the principles underlying the process of manufacture. This lack of knowledge and of the necessary skill in applying it has resulted in many failures, thus rendering the production of a good article uncertain and expensive.

Use only clean, well ripened, but not overripe grapes. After the grapes have been picked wash and place in an aluminum or porcelain lined kettle, cover with boiling water and cook until soft. Some tantes like to separate readily from the pulp, mash with a wire potato masher and place in a jelly bag to drain. Do not squeeze the juice out, but hang on a nail to drain. If you wish to get as much as possible from your fruit, after most of the juice has drained from the pulp, it can be put through a sieve and the seeds and skins removed from the pulp. Sugar can then be added and all cooked until thick, and that makes an excellent marmalade.

Place the clear juice in a kettle, add about a cupful of sugar to each quart of juice. Some tantes like it sweeter than others, and if the grapes are very ripe it will require less sugar than when they first ripen. Bring quickly to the boiling point, skim, and put immediately in sterilized cans, being careful to fill the cans slowly at first and shake the hot juice up on to the sides, as the cans break much more readily than with canned fruit. Seal quickly, and you will seldom have a can work or mold.

A serious mistake is sometimes made by putting the juice into bottles so large that much of it becomes spoiled before it is used. If the bottles are opened, unfermented grape juice properly made and bottled will keep indefinitely if it is not exposed to the atmosphere or mold germ, but when a bottle is once opened it should, like canned goods, be used as soon as possible to keep it from spoiling.

The average housewife has not learned to eat canned apples, does not know, in the majority of cases, that such fine gallon apples are to be obtained and at an actual saving over the fresh fruit. The canners have not pushed this line of goods, except to the bakers, and the wholesalers and retailers, as usual, have done nothing to inform the public. If gallon apples were packed in a proper fashion and the people knew of them in cans it would take an apple crop as large as the present record one every year to supply the demand for them in cans. And there would probably be more money in them for the canners than in any of the great staple crops as now sold.

Making the Little Farm Pay

As land increases in value farms decrease in size. The average farm will soon be less than a hundred acres. Men and women are getting the vision of ten, twenty, and forty-acre tracts so handled as to yield a sufficient income for family maintenance.

When farmers learn to cut out the waste and to secure larger returns from various articles which at present are regarded as being of little account agriculture will reach a more profitable basis. A correct principle in conducting any place, large or small, is to have each interest prominent enough so that it will receive proper attention. If it is an orchard, a vineyard, a poultry yard, a pigeon loft or a variety of such things aim to make each product pay a definite amount. Let there be enough to it so that it can have a reasonable amount of time and attention.

Housewives have a full share of responsibility in this particular. They should be able to prevent all kinds of fruit and vegetables going to waste by methods of canning and preserving. On some farms enough preventable wastes occur almost every year.
