trenches is not pleasant work, they are filled with siush, awing to the constant rains, and exposed to the fire of the enemy's batteries, yet we must remain under cover. There is talk of a great battle very soon, of a general attack; and I hope even at the expense of my own life, that we will make the cuts of the great bear give in. Last Sunday being their patron saint's day, they were sirging Te Deume, ringing bolls, beating drums, &c., and afterwards they were blessed, and told to go and fight the infidol enemy. We were ready to receive them but they never came in view. I hope we will take the place, and send the garrison prisoners to England. I do send the garrison prisoners to England. not like shedding blood, but shed alas! it must be. My health is pretty good. I will have a miserable Cristmas. I wish you a merry one, and a happy new year .- I must conclude by saying I remain your loving son in Christ Jesus,-

Our friends in China are busily engaged with the printing of the first quarter of "The Million" copies of the New Testament, many of which are now ready for circulation. Wears anxiously watching the progress of events in that strange land, and in the meanwhile we are full of hope, knowing that sooner or later " the kingdoms of this world must become the kingdone of our our Lord and his Christ."
