

CEMENT FOR MENDING WARE.— Por a small pinch of shredded gelatine (Nelsor into a wide-mouthed tottle; pour over the very little water and about one-fourth part of glacial ascetic acid. Cork the bottle, and to a short time the gelatine will waelt up to waxen-like pieces, quite clastic, but at the same time firm enough to be handled confortably. The acid insures the preparation keeping indefinitely. When required for use take a small fragment of the swelled gelatine and warm the end of it in the flame of a match or candle. CORN ROLLS.—A lady writer in the Household Department of the "Toledo Blade writes as follows: "I will give a recipe for corn rolls that are splendid." I got the recipe from a Quaker lady, who knew how to make more good things than dyspeptics would dare to eat: Take one pint of corn-meal, pour rit three pints of boiling water, stirring will as you pour, put in three ounces of land, one tablespoonful of salt, and when milk-warm, put in two large spoonfuls of yeast, mix a wheat flour to make a soft dough, cover the pan and put in a warm place to rise; when well risen remove to a bool place; moult them out an hour before you want to have them, and let them wise in the pan."
