Onions are in good supply at \$1.25 per bag. While Beans are sold at \$1.50 to \$1 75 a bushel. Tullow is still in demand at 9_2c per lb. Sall, Canadian, \$1.36 a barrel.

PETROLEUM.—There has been a 'decided advance in refined oils. Prime American is now sold at 26c; and water white at 30c per imperial gallon. Conadian refined has also advanced 'n 2045 for larger lots, and 21c for single barrels.

LEATHER.—There is a steady demand, and prices are maintained as when last quoted. An advance was looked for if the exected advance in hides had taken place. But neither has happened. 
