It is said that Mr. George H. Perley has purchased the interest of A. A. Buell in the Hull Lumber Co., the amount involved is about \$150,000. The business of the company will likely be carried on by the G. H. Perley Company, at Calumet, and the mills, which were burned down in the Hull fire, are not to be rebuilt.

THE Atlantic Grindstone Company, of Providence, Rhode Island, which purchased the grindstone quarry at Lower Cove, N.S., some months ago, intends equipping the quarry with modern machinery, and largely increasing the output. The power is to be suppplied by two 125 horse-power Mumford boilers, and a 250 horse-power Robb-Armstrong engine, which are being built by the Robb Engineering Company, of Amherst, N.S.

An assignment is made by J. B. Kelly, shoe dealer, Calgary, who has been about fourteen years in business. For a considerable time he prospered, and five years ago he claimed a surplus of \$8,000. Last year, in consideration of his being hard pressed for funds, his creditors granted him an extension of time. Evidently this did not relieve him, for he finds that he has a heavy stock of goods on hand and plenty of accounts that he cannot collect just now.

THE offer of 65 per cent., made a few weeks ago to the creditors of C. W. Barkwell, confectioner, at Treherne, Man., has been accepted.—The creditors of J. W. Seaton, hotel keeper, in Vancouver, have closed his premises and sold him out. He had been frequently sued, and his assets were mortgaged. -In the same place, S. Ancorola, confectioner, has also been similarly treated by his creditors. It seems they both deserved it.

LAST year the Land Department of the Canadian Pacific, realizing the importance to the railway company of filling up the large areas of land they possess in the great West, evolved a scheme whereby every resident of the North-West might receive a remuneration for becoming a land agent of the company. A bonus of ten dollars was offered to every farmer, resident in the North-West, who succeeded in disposing to friends in the East of a quarter-section of land situated within a radius of twelve miles from his own farm. This experiment was so successful last year that the company has decided to repeat it.

After some experience in running a planing mill in Goodwood, Ont., Arthur T. Lasher started carriage making about four years ago; but has barely made a living at the business. He has been sued several times of late, and a number of judgments have been obtained against him. Now he assigns .- In September, 1893, Neil N. McDougall opened a tailoring shop in Newmarket, but hardly made a good living; now he assigns .-Richard Scott, who followed farming at Tory Hill for many years, but wanted a more congenial occupation, bought the general stock of J. N. Anderson, a year ago. Already his assignment is announced.
